The 2030 Agenda

- **A much wider scope**, going beyond the predominantly ‘social’ goals of the MDGs, and now incorporating more fully aspects of economic and environmental sustainability, as well as the aspiration for peaceful and inclusive societies.
- **A more ambitious agenda**, seeking to eliminate rather than reduce poverty, and with more demanding targets on health, education, and gender equality.
- **A universal agenda**, applying to all countries and all people, with an explicit recognition that international collective action is required on many issues.

Implications: UNDP's Interpretation



- Reinforces UNDP's long standing advocacy for a **human-centred approach**
- Calls for **integration** beyond silos and prioritizing actions that move us forward more quickly across a broad range of inter-linked goals
- Demands us to reach the **last mile** of exclusion, addressing the economic, social, and political factors of disenfranchisement
- It will be essential to **manage risk** and strengthen resilience, across all areas of the agenda
- Embracing **universality** means that national choices need to be informed by the actions of others, calling for policy coherence and the provision of regional and global public goods.

MAPS – UNDS common approach



MAINSTREAMING

- **Landing the SDG agenda at the national and local levels:** integration into national and sub-national plans for development; and into budget allocations



ACCELERATION

- **Focus on priority areas** defined by respective countries
- Support an **integrated approach**, including synergies and trade-offs
- **Bottlenecks assessment**, financing and partnerships, and measurement



POLICY SUPPORT

- **Support – skills and experience - from respective UN agencies to countries**, which should be made available at a low cost in a timely manner

MAPS



- **Pay attention to cross-cutting issues:**

- ✓ Partnerships
- ✓ Accountability
- ✓ Data



- MAPS components **will not follow a sequential order**, but can frame a coherent approach to describe the support that the UN development system can provide

- ✓ **UNDESA, RECs and undg responsible for providing guidance for reporting on SDGs and information on SDG progress to the High Level Political Forum.**
- ✓ **UNFPA and UNEP lead on Programme Management Arrangements, and connection of the UNDAF to the MAPS**
- ✓ **UNDP and UNICEF promote the foundations for partnerships and for a toolkit for SDG Acceleration.**
- ✓ **ILO leads on the an inventory of tools/approaches for SDG Implementation**
- ✓ **SDG Working Group Takes forward analysis of the implications of Agenda 2030 for development cooperation and for our strategic approach to support SDG implementation.**
- ✓ **UNDP is making available policy and programme support, as well as financial resources, to support 21 UNCTs with the initial roll-out of mainstreaming.**
